# Council Briefs 3/13/2023:

**Approved the consent agenda: Including:** 2/13/2023 council minutes, bills totaling \$51,361.69, and treasurer's report with receipts totaling \$56,61.85.

**Guests:** Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Jessica Moldan – 660 10<sup>th</sup> Street, and Brittany Galetka GFW

**Reports:** Fox: Xcel pole was replaced, purchases equipment or hydrant flow testing. Lead service line inventories due by October 16, 2024. **Peterson:** 125 celebration committee 3/16 at 7pm in the community center. **Burger:** LBAE at 6:30 for the April Meeting, ARPA funds need to be spent before the end of 2024. **Klingler:** New fire fighter, council approved the application, relief looking into a craft beer and wine tasting council approved the street closure in from of the fire hall. Approved up to \$1500 to upgrade the radio system in the city's pumper.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

Fox presented the updates for the RO Project. The electrical updates by Xcel and Isenberg Electric's were approved for \$4,144.11. Council approved to accept the engineer's recommendation for Harn R/O Systems LLC's proposal, to complete the Pilot study for the RO Plant at a cost of almost \$74,000 plus expenses. Council approved moving to the RO Project fund, \$24,000 out of each of the water and sewer funds, if the grant money was not available before bills need to be paid. The Pilot project equipment will be placed to the west of the water facility from approximately May 1 until the end of July. Council also approved the proposed exterior building design.

#### New Business:

Donation of \$300 was approved from the Sibley/Nicollet County Corn & Soybean growers for the community center.

# Local Board of Appeals & Equalization (LBAE) in April:

You received the **VALUATION NOTICE** from Nicollet County showing the proposed value of your property to be used for the property taxes paid in 2024. If you do not feel the value of your property is correct, **Follow the instructions on the notice...** you will need to contact the county assessor to discuss your property **before** the deadline to request a review. After the review they will then bring the information to the April 10, 2023 hearing for the council to approve or deny. The meeting will be held in the council chambers at 6:30 pm with the council meeting agenda following.
