#### Compost Protocol:

Reminder of the protocol for the compost area. We are licensed and monitored by the DNR and must abide by their rules.

There are TWO piles:

One for yard and garden waste ONLY organic! No bags, flower pots, décor etc. when you dump - get as close to the pile as possible.

The second pile is for brush and branches 3-inches or less only. Please help us to keep our location in compliance.

# Council Briefs 4/10/2023:

Local Board of Appeals & Equalization Hearing: Shana Jackson Nicollet County Assessor - there were no valuation appeals. The assessor's office will be doing their 5-year update of all properties in Lafayette. There will be a letter sent, if no response a note on the door. They will try to connect with everyone.

Approved the consent agenda: Including: 3/13/2023 council minutes, bills totaling \$106,889.72, and treasurer's report with receipts totaling \$52,207.19. Guests: Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Jessica Moldan – 660 10<sup>th</sup> Street, Dave Burger – 580 Main Avenue, and Heidi Portner – 651 5<sup>th</sup> Street and Angie Hartmann – 411 Skyview Avenue, to represent Park & Rec. Reports: Fox: Compost not open yet due to snowmelt. Will complete the curb & gutter on east Pioneer. Peterson: 125 celebration committee, attended LMC Safety & Loss – good sessions. Burger: Attended MCFOA conference and LMC Safety & Loss – great sessions, working with Ambulance for 5/31 reporting for Ground ambulance data collection mandate. Klingler: Inquired about installing a cold/hot water to the east side of the fire barn to help clean rigs, will revisit once generators are purchased-installed from ARPA funds. Asked that the non-profit fundraiser rental fee for Relief be waived, council waived. Polich: Attended 125<sup>th</sup>, zoning committee. Portner: Attended Storm spotter training.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

Working with the EPA & Engineers on grant information & requirements. Storage container is ordered to house the pilot project from May through July. It will sit on the street during this time. Fire Truck committee will meet 4/11. Zoning committee met; discussion was tabled until the city attorney was present.

#### **New Business:**

**Approved:** Donation of \$69 was approved from the mini park donation bucket at FillMeUp, 2 permits for an addition by Tauber and remove and build a shed for Isaacson S&S, Policy stating the city Fire will not fill pools, there is an option of a second meter for this purpose, WC premium of \$22,128, fire fighter Ben Anderson, a member of a neighboring department, but is available during the day, Ambulance 2023 officers, \$2,000 to the 125<sup>-</sup>Year Celebration committee.

H. Portner & A. Hartmann inquired about a liquor license for selling beer at the pop shack for tournaments.
