Spring Reminders!

Pet owners: DOGS: There have been instances where someone is walking with or without their dog and another dog runs out in the street to greet them. This can be an extremely scary situation for the walker, especially if they are not dog lovers. Please remember if you have your dog out in your yard that you must have full control of your pet. When you are out walking your dog, **please take a bag along to clean up their feces** and dispose of it when you get home. **CATS:** Again, there are many feral cats in town – if they are fed, they will stay. Do not feed them, hopefully they will migrate to where they can find food. Also, if you are a cat owner, they too are to be under the owner's full control if outside. We have had multiple verbal complaints of cats wandering to a neighbor's yard/garden and defecating on their property.

MOWING – Do Not Mow into the Street: When mowing your yard or business lawn, remember that you **cannot mow clippings into the street**. Plan your mowing so that the outside swipes are blown into the yard, not onto the street. **Reasons:** it can wash into the ditch system and promote algae growth downstream and it can also be dangerous for two wheeled motorists, as it can be slippery when wet and cause tires to lose grip on the road.

COMPOST: Use the blacktop road out to the compost site. There are two piles, one for yard & garden waste – grass, weeds, leaves, and such and the other is for branches and brush under 3 inches in diameter. **Unload your items on or as close to the existing pile as possible; do not just drop it anywhere by the pile & NO TRASH!**

Council Briefs 5/8/2023:

Approved the consent agenda: Including: 4/10/2023 council minutes, bills totaling \$51,826.02, and treasurer's report with receipts totaling \$28,279.70.

Guests: Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Jessica Moldan – 660 10th Street, Dave Burger – 580 Main Avenue.

Reports: Fox: UV at WWTF started, street sweeping began, P&R requested concrete pad, they will donate \$3000 asking Lions \$2000, city \$728, council approved. CCR report in June newsletter, ARPA funds - decided to purchase a generator for the fire hall for emergencies. **Peterson:** presented dates for an outdoor market for June-August council approved advertising, Read Certificate of Commendation from the State for the WWTF Burger: Nicollet county assessor will be in Lafayette for the 5-year property inspections, postcards were sent, working with gWorks who recently purchased UBMax, our utility billing, RS Fiber water tower lease agreement council approved going forward with asking \$250 per month for a 2year lease. Klingler: Two new fire fighters passed class Polich: dogs running into street - Burger will put a reminder in the newsletter **Portner:** propane burn – council gave fire dept approval to hold it in the triangle by the salt shed - he will alert Isenberg Electric & N Langhoff. Tauber: stray cat issue

Unfinished Business:

Fox received the EPA Grant implementation guidance, reviewed and started the application. RO hookup completed, technicians 5/15. Fire Truck committee met, looked at used truck options, nothing decided. Zone committee met 4/19 went over a few more areas, city attorney working on the variance and sign sections. Once completed will be presented to council for first reading. 125-year – setting up a separate checking not an option Burger set up a separate fund in the city CTAS accounting software. Will meet 5/10

New Business:

Approved: \$1755.21 donation to ambulance, \$475 donation to 125-celebration, Schiller permit with stipulation the water shutoff is always available and the drive through a non-permanent surface, first reading of Ord 143 – and set the hearing for the June meeting, approved the fire relief temporary liquor license for Friday, July 28. Approved changing to a higher interest savings and purchasing a \$200,000 4% 15-month CD at Citizens, approved Fox to sign agreement for the PFAS Recovery Program.

FYI: Peterson handed out Blight tour packets, after cleanup day council will tour their assigned section of town and give addresses to the clerk for a list for the June blight tour.
