Council Briefs 6/12/2023:

Council held their annual blight tour prior to the meeting.

Public Hearing for Ord. 143- Adopting the Interim ordinance to the zoning ordinance. No public comments.

Approved the consent agenda: Including: 5/8/2023 council minutes, bills totaling \$85,598.36, and treasurer's report with receipts totaling \$50,894.00.

Guests: Doug Hanson – Winthrop Publications, Jessica Moldan – 660 10th Street, Tim Myers – 740 Lafayette Avenue, Mac Aalid – 660 Esther Avenue and Patty Jo Ferguson – 711 Lafayette Avenue.

Reports: Fox: Submitted report and revisited the generator decision – tabled until next month. **Peterson:** Please with food truck events and looking forward to the outdoor markets. Thanks Fox and Moldan for their work during the rain event. **Burger:** Submitted report and updated council on the Legion Paver project and the bandstand project. **Tauber:** Concern of the large vacant properties in town – looked into DEED grants. **Dick:** Looking to purchase new ambulance equipment.

Unfinished Business:

RO: Changed the plan to remove the underground storage and added a second option to the layout to provide storage and workspace. There is state bonding with 50-50 match that can use federal funding – council approved Fox to file the application. Adopted the interim ordinance into the zoning code with Ord. 143. Zoning committee update was tabled until July. Snow Policy review – after further discussion council felt that leaving the ordinance and policy as is.

New Business:

Approved: June Donations totaling \$9,277.97, of which \$750 to the ambulance from Dave's Place from tips and donations at the steak fry, \$2,700 to the 125th celebration: \$200 from Happy Tails and \$2500 from the Lions, \$827.97 to the Community Center from the Lions for new equipment and \$5,000.00 to the park for the concrete: \$2,000 from park & rec and \$,3000 from the Lions. Permits for Klingler addition to the shed, and D Portner for a fence. Personnel Policy: added Juneteenth – June 19th holiday and updating the wording in the drug-free workplace section. Discussed updates to the water & sewer ordinances – no action was taken. Burger was directed by council to send letters to the blight properties. Peterson will review before the next meeting.
